

CEO's OVERVIEW

2017 was yet again another enormous year for AFLNT, with many achievements, milestones and events. As I sit and reflect on it all it really hits home how much our diverse business worked tirelessly together to achieve so many things.

One of the significant accomplishments was a 6% growth in total participation, which means there is now almost a quarter of Territorians involved in football. It proves once again that Australia's game is alive and well in the NT.

The premiership success of the Crows women's team, including nine Territory players and numerous support staff, in the inaugural AFLW season was an amazing feat celebrated nationally.

The announcement of an NT Thunder team in the VFL Women's competition in 2018 and renaming of the State Academy to the NT Thunder Academy finalised the missing piece of the puzzle with the pathways on the men's and women's side being fully replicated. This is on the back of women and girls making up 34.3% of Australian football participants in the NT, and three Territorian men and seven women drafted to AFL clubs at the end of 2017.

School football grew by an incredible 95.1% and AFLNT in conjunction with AFLQ were able to field our first ever AFL Inclusion Carnival team.

NITV not only continued to broadcast NT Thunder games but also NTFL games weekly along with SCTV, which means we have now covered a national and regional market with our exciting Territory brand of footy. With this comes the exciting news of a live broadcast of the 2017/18 TIO NTFL Grand Final, and our game has never had so much air time.

Government funding helped us with change room upgrades, new light towers, improvements to the coaches's boxes and bathrooms, plus perimeter fencing. Add to this the sell out AFL game in July and an international Rugby World Cup final, and TIO Stadium truly is the elite sporting stadium in the NT.

Seventy years of the Central Australian Football League was celebrated in Alice Springs in September and Rovers held off Federals to take the premiership, while we had strong support for NT Thunder's NEAFL fixture which was preceded by the first intra-Territory women's game when the Redtails hosted the Top End team in June.

NT Thunder, made up of 49% Indigenous players, competed in NEAFL finals for the fourth consecutive year, under the direction of Head Coach Andrew Hodges. Meanwhile, the Club Champion had a makeover, being renamed the Ilett Medal in honour of the great contribution brothers Jarred and Cam have made to the Club.

In the NTFL; three clubs celebrated their centenary years in Waratah, Wanderers and Darwin Buffaloes. St Mary's won the Premier League premiership to go back to back in the men's competition and Darwin Buffaloes caused the upset on the women's side. The introduction of the fly in player rule and points system has seen a more even competition in the 2017/18 NTFL season with the race for the premiership more open than ever before.

The continued success of the Michael Long Learning and Leadership Centre and its remote programs saw 237 students from remote regions come to Darwin for a one week education program based on the AFL values. Our remote projects have 10 staff engaged in nine regions across the NT to facilitate football competitions and programs, which meant full seasons of men's football were played in Galiwinku and Groote Eylandt for the first time since 2014 and the first AFLNT managed competition in Gunbalanya brought the community together.



As touched on in last year's report, the executive finalised a three year strategic plan and clearly set out the direction in which the organisation will move. The basis of our plan has input from all levels of the business and is shaped by our continued commitment to protect and nurture the game.

Once again, I would like to echo the words of the Chairman and thank our sponsors, Government partners and all others involved whose level of financial support allows us to do what we do.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my time at AFLNT as CEO and am proud of all the achievements made by a hard working team, who strive to leave this great game we all love in a better place. I am sure I will continue to watch Territory football with pride and wish you all the best for the future.

AFLNT FINANCIAL REPORT Year Ended 31 October 2017

The audited financial statements of AFL Northern Territory Limited, for the year ended 31 October 2017 are attached for your perusal and adoption at this meeting.

The accompanying notes form part of the accounts and should be read in conjunction with them to understand the Organisation's financial affairs.

Financial Position

The Company has recorded a statutory profit of \$3,771 for the year ended 31st October 2017, which was slightly down from the net profit in the prior year of (\$5,200).

Key financial results for the 2017 Financial Year included:

- 1. Overall revenues increased by \$167,000 largely due to increased grants and investment from parent entity the AFL (\$404,000). Commercial revenues continued to be difficult to secure across the Territory and were well down on budget.
- 2. Employee expenses were in line with prior year at \$4.8m, but were down on budget due to the timing of start up of new positions. There were 45 full time staff employed at the end of the financial year (prior year: 40)
- 3. NTFL Club Debt owing to AFL NT remained at record lows

There was also a continued focus on renewing and retaining key government and corporate support for our Remote Programs. Pleasingly most of this key funding was secured again for another two years in October 2017.

Given all of the above the end of year results are very pleasing and all departmental managers and the CEO of AFLNT should be congratulated for these results.

The Statement of Financial Position (Balance Sheet) is still strong with the current assets exceeding the current liabilities by \$463,538 which enables all accounts to be met as they fall due which is a very healthy position to be in.


